**AGGIORNAMENTI**

**Tiberius right / globe and rudder**

Between *c.* AD 34-35 and 36-37, Tiberius issued a very common *as* (RIC<sup>2</sup>, nos. 52, 58 and 64) with on the reverse a rudder placed vertically across a banded globe, with a small globe to the base of the rudder, and the legend **PONTIF MAX TR POT XXXVI** (or **XXXVII** or **XXXIIX**) around and S-C to left and right. The obverse is usually a laureate head of Tiberius left, with the legend **TI CAESAR DIVI AVG F AVGVST IMP VIII** around.

I illustrate an example of RIC<sup>2</sup>, no. 52 (with the date, **TR POT XXXVI**), but with the head of Tiberius right, not left. It appears to be unpublished. This is probably a river coin, and is undoubtedly ancient. There is no stylistic or other reason not to regard it as a genuine, official piece. The weight is 9.16 g and the relationship of the axes is ←.
